

## Hama Province - Revolution Dossier

**Summary:** Province with recurrent frontline pressure and major rural-security strain.

**Where:** Northern Hama countryside and adjoining front corridors toward Idlib.

**What happened:** Offensives, artillery exchanges, displacement cycles, and repeated line instability.

**Why it mattered:** Hama front geography formed a hinge between central Syria and northwest battle maps.

**Detention / Saydnaya:** Detention concerns were repeatedly reported in conflict and post-operation periods.

**Chemical dossier:** Chemical allegations in the broader Hama-Idlib axis appeared in international discussions, including incidents cited in legal dossiers.
