

Latakia Province - Revolution Dossier

Summary: Strategic coastal governorate tied to logistics, military depth, and population movements.

Where: Latakia city, mountain hinterland, and lines adjacent to Idlib fronts.

What happened: Rear-base military logistics, periodic security incidents, and war-economy pressure on services.

Why it mattered: Coastal depth provided strategic support corridors and institutional continuity leverage.

Detention / Saydnaya: Detention concerns exist, though public focus often centered on front-adjacent provinces.

Chemical dossier: No flagship chemical dossier centered in Latakia in main international case framing.
