

Quneitra Province - Revolution Dossier

Summary: Border-adjacent province with volatile control patterns and constrained recovery.

Where: Quneitra countryside and disengagement-line-adjacent communities.

What happened: Shifting armed presence, local arrangements, and fragile service restoration.

Why it mattered: Border geography amplified strategic sensitivity beyond local demographics.

Detention / Saydnaya: Detention issues were reported through different security actors and periods.

Chemical dossier: No principal chemical red-line case is anchored in Quneitra in the core dossier.
